Within a radius of maximum 5 hours

<u>Treasure hunt</u>	Valais's family destinations have created specially laid out paths packed with exciting puzzles and tricky tasks for guests both young and old.
<u>Children's snow playgrounds</u>	Valais's snow playgrounds for children are ideal places for youngsters of all ages, allowing them to romp around in the snow and gain their first taste of winter sports.
<u>Bisses</u>	A host of trails along the bisse irrigation canals offer varied hikes on historic paths.
<u>Rope parks</u>	Built into the beautiful landscape, rope parks offer exciting and varied courses for all ages and abilities.
<u>Sledging</u>	Fast-paced, secured trails wind their way for kilometres through the unspoilt winter landscape.
<u>Dog Sledding</u>	Dog sledding is a winter experience that will delight everyone from kids to grandparents: the sled glides smoothly behind the huskies as they draw you through the snowy landscape.
<u>Mountain carts, Riederalp</u>	The mountain cart – a cross between a go-kart and a sledge – is the perfect vehicle for mastering the terrain.
<u>Alpine garden, Aletsch Arena</u>	Visit a very special garden featuring more than 200 plant species indigenous to the Aletsch area, as well as a variety of habitats including mountain meadows, rocky outcrops, dwarf shrub heath and megaphorb.
<u>Ravensburger games trail, Grächen</u>	Scattered across the hiking area around Grächen are eight games cabins and seven activity stations.
<u>Baking rye bread, Grächen</u>	From grain to bread: the bread is first kneaded in the open air according to grandmother's recipe, then baked in a wood-fired oven.
<u>Dwonhill scooters, Grächen</u>	Hop onto a mountain downhill scooter with extra-wide tyres and hydraulic disc brakes and ride back to the village via a specially designed route.
<u>Zoo und swimming pool, Les Marecottes</u>	Discover alpine fauna including deer, marmots, foxes and black bears in their natural environment over an area of 35,000m ² .
<u>Aquaparc, Le Bouveret</u>	The Aquaparc water park offers fun for the whole family in five different adventure zones.
<u>Western City, Martigny</u>	The Western City park covers an area of 10,000m ² and comprises a total of 70 challenges in the five adventure zones.
<u>Barryland, Martigny</u>	This lively museum is a meeting place that brings people together with the St Bernards of the Great St. Bernard Pass.
<u>Japanese gardens, Nendaz</u>	At the top of a glacial moraine, hikers can enjoy the Japanese Garden, which naturally resembles a landscaped garden.
<u>Mittelallalin Ice Pavilion, Saas-Fee</u>	A 70-metre-long tunnel leads from the mountain station of the "Metro-Alpin" funicular railway directly into a 5,000m ² ice grotto in the mysterious interior of the millennial Fee Glacier.
<u>Glacier Trail, Saas-Fee</u>	The trail combines scientific insights with a hike through a landscape shaped by glaciers.
<u>Bobsled run, Saas-Fee</u>	Take a one- or two-person ride on the steepest of bobsled lifts up to one of the highest roller-coaster bobsled runs in the Alps. A pure adrenaline rush!

<u>Escape room, Zermatt</u>	The Zermatt Escape Rooms are perfect for friends who want to have an exciting evening or escape a rainy day.
<u>Glacier palace, Zermatt</u>	Two passenger lifts take you from the Matterhorn Glacier Paradise station up to the icy, mystical world of the lofty Glacier Palace.
<u>Ricola herb garden, Zermatt</u>	The Ricola herb garden near the hamlet of Blatten is an entertaining and educational experience for the whole family.
<u>Matterhorn museum, Zermatt</u>	Here, you can immerse yourself in the mountain world of yesteryear and see how the inhabitants of Zermatt lived in the 19th century.
<u>Suonen- und Sudelpark, Unterbäch</u>	At this bisse water park, children can divert the water by hand and run it through wooden and stone canals, over aqueducts and through water wheels into pools.
<u>World Nature Forum, Naters</u>	On 22 September 2016, the World Nature Forum (WNF) was opened in Naters as a unique visitor, study and congress centre for this UNESCO World Heritage Site.
<u>Children's-geocaching, Bürchen</u>	A fun hobby in which you use satellite navigation on a treasure hunt. GPS devices can be borrowed for free from the tourist office.
<u>«Gsteinät» recreation park, Lötschental</u>	The “Gsteinät” recreation park in Wiler offers a breath of fresh air for you and your family: you can practise sports such as football, volleyball, table tennis, tennis, basketball and mini golf.
<u>Labyrinth adventure, Evionnaz</u>	Thousands of Thuja trees line the three-kilometre-long maze where mysterious treasures and games are hidden. An amazing playground awaits at the end.
<u>Swiss Vapeur Parc, Le Bouveret</u>	At the Swiss Vapeur Parc, miniature steam trains on a scale of 1:4 travel through a 17,000m ² park complete with model buildings.
<u>Castle Chillon, Vevytau</u>	Switzerland's most visited historic building is located on a rocky island on the shores of Lake Geneva.
<u>Chaplin's World, Corsier sur Vevey</u>	A museum for laughing, learning and having fun in the universe of Charlie Chaplin
<u>Olympic Museum, Lausanne</u>	The history of the Olympic Games from antiquity to modern times can be traced at the Olympic Museum in Lausanne.
<u>Champ-Pittet, Yverdon-les-Bains</u>	The Champ-Pittet Pro Natura Centre is located in the southern part of the Grande Carrière, the largest lakeshore wetland in Switzerland.
<u>Papiliorama and Nocturama, Kerzers</u>	The tropical gardens of Papiliorama and Nocturama in Kerzers are home to plants and animals from the tropics.
<u>Weissenstein, Oberdorf</u>	Solothurn's local mountain, situated on the first and highest chain of the Jura mountains, offers an impressive view and attractions including the Nidlenloch cave system.
<u>Basel Zoo</u>	Opened in 1874, Basel Zoo is affectionately called “Zolli” and is home to a large number of native and exotic animals.
<u>Chocolat Frey visitors centre, Buchs</u>	If you've always wanted to know how chocolate is made or how a cocoa bean tastes, the Chocolat Frey experience has all the answers.
<u>Zoo & Masoala Regenwald, Zurich</u>	Located on the Zürichberg mountain, the zoo is home to 350 animal species in natural habitats.
<u>Museum of</u>	The most-visited museum in Switzerland shows the past, present and future of mobility in an exciting and

<u>Animal parc Dählhölzli, Bern</u>	A petting zoo and a large playground make the Dählhölzli an ideal family excursion destination.
<u>Ballenberg open-air museum, Hofstetten</u>	Ballenberg's open-air museum is home to 109 original historical buildings from all parts of Switzerland, as well as native farm animals, typical gardens and fields.
<u>St. Beatus caves, Sundlauenen</u>	A wondrous world of caves with a fabulous past near Lake Thun.
<u>Tropical house, Frutigen</u>	Mountain water, a fish farm, and a tropical garden: a harmonious trio and an innovative energy concept under one roof.
<u>Lake Blausee, Kandergrund</u>	A small blue lake in the middle of a romantic nature park, surrounded by barbecue areas, picnic spots and a children's playground.
<u>Monte Tamaro, Rivera-Monteceneri</u>	An unrivalled natural playground, Ticino's mountain with a panoramic view is home to Mario Botta's Santa Maria degli Angeli chapel.
<u>Swissminiatur, Melide</u>	At Swissminiatur you can visit Switzerland's most famous and archetypal monuments and places – built to a scale of 1:25.
<u>Isola Bella, Lago Maggiore</u>	Isola Bella was considered a wonder of the world during the 18th century, and still makes for a varied family excursion today.
<u>Europapark</u>	The famous leisure and amusement park in Rust, Germany, is less than four hours from Visp.
<u>Gardaland</u>	Italy's largest theme park on Lake Garda is less than four hours from Visp.

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
